2. We had a visiting youth group from Enumclaw, WA. It was a blessed connection to see a group of youngsters willing to help us move chairs and equipment at 8:45am after they had slept on the floor of the church. Our church membership has grown this year, and we've welcomed new faces and we feel the energy of new connections and relationships. And this youth group was like that too. It also reminds us that the body of Christ is larger than we know, usually larger and more diverse than we can imagine.

Relationship. We help and care. We are stronger together.

3. Okay, we have done some work together. And we're facing a new direction. Then the gospel reading included Jesus being blunt and single-minded. He "has set his face toward Jerusalem." Does this fit our outdoor context of invitation and welcome?

Well, as I posted the video of the sermon to YouTube I could birds singing and chirping in the background of this (serious) gospel reading. Should birds be singing while Jesus barks out the orders and marches on?!

What if it all fits? What if it's all true, and all at once?

What a mystery and miracle. I don't know about you, but being in nature brought a comfort even as Jesus pushed his listeners to the hard work of following.

I felt as Howard Thurman has said:

The earth beneath my feet is the great womb out of which the life upon which my body depends comes in utter abundance. There is at work in the soil a mystery by which the death of one seed is reborn a thousandfold in newness of life. The magic of wind, sun and rain creates a climate that nourishes every living thing. It is law, and more than law; it is order, and more than order—there is a brooding tenderness out of which it all comes. In the contemplation of the earth, I know that I am surrounded by the love of God.

4-H volunteer Linda Zimmerman named

4-H Western Region Outstanding Lifetime Volunteer

Linda Zimmerman, 4-H volunteer for University of Nevada, Reno Extension for over 34 years and a University alumna, is one of only four 4-H volunteers nationally to have recently been named a 4-H Outstanding Lifetime Volunteer. Zimmerman was named the 4-H Western Region Outstanding Lifetime Volunteer as part of the 4DH Salute to Excellence Awards for her dedication and service to Extension's Washoe County 4-H Horse Program and support of youth statewide.

Participating in the 4-H Youth Development Program as a youth herself, Zimmerman went from being a club member to being the parent of 4-H youth, and then a 4-H club leader and a 4-H Leaders' Council member. Her positive impact on youth in her club has inspired many past participants to enroll their own children in the program, and to become 4-H leaders themselves.

Having earned her doctoral degree in social psychology from the University of Nevada, Reno, she is interested in trying new strategies for engagement and retention, while supporting youth and their families in figuring out how best to participate in clubs and activities.

"Linda understands some youth may struggle in different areas as they join 4-H or try to engage in activities or projects," said Carrie Stark, Nevada's 4-H state director. "She goes above and beyond to assist them, finding a way to help them with extra time, resources and meetings to overcome their struggles. She exemplifies positive youth-adult partnerships."

For three decades, Zimmerman has served as the 4-H Horse Leader for the Silver Knolls Spurs in Washoe County, managing horse shows and serving as the secretary for others. She has served both on the Washoe County 4-H Horse Leaders' Council and the General Washoe County Leaders' Council for over 15 years.
