COUNCIL REPORT

Below are the main updates from your Church Council this month:

- 1. Nevada Sage Waldorf School, currently renting classroom space from us, has contracted to buy the property across the street and to the west of here: The Greater Light Church, formerly the Episcopal church. They are moving forward with those plans, and we wanted to update you that they will fulfill the contract with us through July 15th, 2023 and then will be moved in as our across the street neighbors. We are thankful they've rented from us for these past two years and bless them and wish them well at the new property!
- 2. On March 18th your Church Council took extra time from their schedules to be together on a Saturday for a planning and sharing retreat. We talked about Leadership qualities, the vision of Faith Lutheran Church expressed over the years, and goals your council can focus on this year together. We are proud to serve as your council and this helps focus our efforts to maximize what we can do while elected to these positions. So here are the goals:

We want to better manage our Parking Lot;

- 3a) We are organizing work groups to clean it up, make it accessible and traversable, and redo striping. This focus is to help our most vulnerable travelers park and safely/easily access our building with ease and welcome. This will happen this month of April.
- 3b) We will do some leg work and then consider approaching the congregation for a longer term investment vision of redoing the lot to be looking great, welcoming for all, and a part of our property we can be proud of.
- 4. We want to connect our people to needs in our wider community;

We are working on communication plans to our church, organizing the raising up of team leaders and hosting events/information times. So far this year we are considering promoting connections to: Elmcrest Elementary School, Foster the City (a program which helps churches support foster families), our Shared Harvest, our Food Pantry, campus connections at UNR, and more!

5. Dreaming and planning revitalization of our church's Memorial Garden;

We are proud of our beautiful space and it has long been an asset of our congregation. So, we believe that we should be good stewards of our building, parking lot, and yard, and that our care will translate to our members, potential members, and the wider community.

Along these lines, and with the school transitioning out of our spaces, we have a new chance to make changes, invest in accessible plans, plant and envision and pull up what needs to go.

We will organize interested team members and then we plan to put some designs/ proposals before the congregation. Exciting! We are motivated and we're using our gifts as a team to serve you. Please reach out to council members with any questions, needs, or ideas along the way!

IN WORSHIP THIS MONTH

April 2 – Palm/Passion Sunday

Today we enter Holy Week with a service that begins with a Palm Sunday procession, tells the story of Christ's passion from the gospel of Matthew, and ends with anticipation of the unfolding of Holy Week. This week in our church stands at the center of our worship year. The sermon today is the passion story, taken from the "Cotton Patch Gospel" version of Matthew by Clarence Jordan.





April 6 – Maundy Thursday

At 7:00 p.m. we gather for worship including Holy Communion and Washing of Hands. "Maundy" is related to our word for "mandate" or "command," for tonight our readings come from Jesus' last supper and his command: "As I have loved you, love one another."

April 7 – Good Friday in Midnight Blues

At 7:00 p.m. we gather for a service of Tenebrae, the growing darkness. Tenebrae is Latin for "shadow." Our readings trace the steps of Jesus' passion from John's gospel, we extinguish candles, approaching the darkness, we pray for the whole world in the ancient bidding prayer, and Todd and Louis play the blues.





April 8 – Vigil of Easter

At 7:00 p.m. we gather on this night of Salvation! In this service we gather around fire, word, water, bread, and wine, proclaiming through story and song that ours is a God who continually brings life out of death. We will celebrate baptisms and affirmation of baptisms -- all as we travel from dark to light, renewed in the death and resurrection of Christ. "Christ has arisen and we shall arise!"

April 9 - Resurrection of Our Lord/Easter Day

8:00am - Easter Breakfast!

9:30am - Easter Worship through the new life of Christ! We sing hymns of praise, gather around sacred words, and proclaim God's faithfulness, power, and love in the feast of holy communion. Our



chancel choir will vest, process and recess, and perform "Now the Green Blade Rises." We depart with joy to proclaim the good news of God's endless love.

IN WORSHIP THIS MONTH



April 16 – 2nd Sunday of Easter

Today we continue in the Season of Easter. Our gospel reading in John 20 shows the risen Christ appearing to disciples, offering them the gift of peace. Even amid our doubts and questions we experience the resurrection in our lives and community.

Throughout the coming Sundays of Easter the first two readings will be from the Acts of the Apostles and the first letter of Peter.

April 23 – 3rd Sunday of Easter

Today we continue in the Season of Easter. In the story of disciples walking the "Road to Emmaus," Jesus appears to be with them. They know him only as a fellow traveler until they invite him in for supper and when he breaks the bread, they know it is the Christ!

From ELW hymn #495:

"Jesus, you were dead, but you rose and living, made yourself our bread, in your goodness giving life though we were dead."



April 30 – 4th Sunday of Easter

Today is sometimes called "Good Shepherd Sunday." Jesus is called the "gate" of the sheep in today's gospel. The risen Christ opens the way to abundant life. Each Sunday is spread a feast before us amid the world's violence and war. We go forth to be signs of the resurrection and extend God's tender care to all creation.
