I know the worthy challenge of giving to Christian community, and my life is marked but the deep blessings of receiving from the community too.

Yes, it comes around this time each year, but the sweetness of being the sheep of our loving Shepherd together ... I just don't think we can replace it with anything else we seek. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Greetings, Faith!

Apologies on the lack of a report last month, some poor planning on my part led me to miss the deadline.

So, back in March, the council had a retreat to create several goals that we are interested in pursuing as a congregation. The first goal is the resurfacing or even rebuilding of the church parking lot. For those of you unaware, we've had several members trip and fall while coming from their car to the church and it is nigh impossible for people with walkers to travel the parking lot due to the cracks and debris. We want to correct that safety and accessibility issue first and foremost.

There was also a recommendation that we consider making the parking lot look nicer. It is the first thing that guests see when they drive by or pull into the church, and an attractive parking lot puts the congregation's best foot forward. Regardless of what we do to rehabilitate the parking lot, this will be a very large undertaking, and requires a loan which will require a special congregational meeting.

However, this is just the beginning of this process, we will update you as new information warrants it. Our second goal, similar to our first, is the revitalization of the congregation's memorial garden and yard. The recent winter and the children of the Waldorf school have taken a toll on the grass, and it needs to be addressed. Just as with the parking lot, there are several possibilities with the revitalization. We could simply restore the grass, we could xeriscape the yard while keeping the memorial trees, or something else. We are putting together a committee to look at creating ideas and steering the process. Finally, we want to expand our outreach programs. The congregation has partnered with Elmcrest Elementary School and throughout Lent we donated clothing for the school children. Pastor Shaun and Judi Hein have reached out to Foster the City, a program which works to support families who foster children. Our hope is to find a family from the congregation that we would like to foster, or support a family from elsewhere.

We are also looking to raise up more leaders and volunteers to lead other programs that our congregation currently supports or new programs we might like to begin. So, that's what the congregation council is working on. As always please reach out to me, or any of the council members, if you have any questions or concerns.



We've Got Your Number!

As part of the financial procedures here at Faith Lutheran Church the Financial Secretary tracks financial gifts given as regular, or special offerings, with a number assigned to each giving unit (individual or family). When the Offering Counters process the weekly offerings from the collection plate, the assigned number is verified on an offering envelope with the person's name on it. If the received check isn't in an envelope, the counter writes the member name, number, and gift amount on an envelope; the Financial Secretary utilizes these envelopes in her weekly financial audit. When the offering is placed in the collection plate in the completed envelope (noted with name and number), life is much easier in the counting room.

Some of our FLC members have recently told the Counting Team that they didn't know they even had a 'number' for their offering. So in order to streamline the counting process, we want to be sure everyone that wishes too, has envelopes into which they may place their offering - be it a check or cash. Judy Jack and Linda Zimmerman will be available on **Sunday**, **April 30**, during Fellowship time at the back of the church to provide envelopes and information about your 'number'. Stop by and get a small packet of envelopes, noted with your identifying number, to use for your weekly, monthly, or special offerings.

The envelopes are strictly just a tool to assist the Financial Secretary and Counters. Checks without member numbers, or not in envelopes, will absolutely still be gratefully accepted. As Treasurer LindaLu Miller frequently states, "Faith Lutheran Church is so blessed with such loving and generous financial gifts offered by members and guests". Thank you!
