Jun 4 – Holy Trinity Sunday

The Trinity expresses the heart of our faith: we have experienced the God of creation made known in Jesus Christ and with us always through the Holy Spirit. We celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity in word and sacrament, as we profess the creed, and as we are sent into the world to bear witness to our faith.



From the Augusburg Confession (1530):

"The churches among us teach [...] that there is one divine essence which is called God and is God: eternal, incorporeal, indivisible, of immeasurable power, wisdom and goodness, the creator and preserver of all things, visible and invisible. Yet there are three persons, coeternal and of the same essence and power: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit."

Jun 11 – Healing Service - Second Sunday after Pentecost



Though Jesus was a devout Jew who practiced his faith, he was criticized for eating with tax collectors and sinners—the religiously nonobservant. Jesus criticizes the self-righteous and reminds us that mercy is to be at the heart of our religious practices. God continues to be made known in those on the margins of society, like Matthew the tax collector and the hemorrhaging woman. As we gather each Lord's day we receive the healing that makes us well and sends us forth. On this particular Sunday we will offer prayer stations and prayers with oils for anointing. All are welcome!

Jun 18 – Third Sunday after Pentecost - Father's Day

The choir sings an Anthem on Praising God.

Moses tells the Israelites that they are called to be a priestly kingdom and a holy people. Jesus sends out the disciples as laborers into the harvest. In baptism we all are anointed for ministry, sharing God's compassion with our needy world.
