# PRESIDENT'S REPORT

#### Greetings, Faith!

We're gearing up to have a special congregation meeting in the next month or so to address several different topics. The topic with the highest price tag and probably the most interest is the repaving of the parking lot. The council had originally hoped to hold the meeting on August 20th, just before the picnic, but we have been convinced that the discussions about such a large amount of money and the obligations the church will incur will take too much time and encroach on the time set aside for the picnic. We may still try to have a short meeting to vote on some "smaller" items. One of those smaller items is whether we should pay off the rest of the principal of the loan that paid for the roof repairs. There is just under \$40,000 left on the loan. The council would like to pay off the loan before we take on another.

Another item is the opportunity we have to "hire" our own Sarah Toney, MDiv, for the length of time she is with us as she waits for her first call. Sarah has a particular interest in how we as Christians enrich our interactions with Christ and Christianity, both inside and outside the church. Now some of you will say: that is well and good, but we would like to make Pastor Shaun full-time before we bring anyone else on the payroll. I understand that sentiment, but Pastor Shaun has stated that he is much more interested in collaboration than increasing his pay from the church at this time. I don't know if anyone believes this when I say/write it, but you can ask him if you doubt me.

One last thing I'd like to communicate: with the impending special congregational meetings upon us, I want to take the opportunity to remind you all that during these meetings the congregation itself is sovereign in these decisions. Neither Pastor Shaun, nor I, nor the rest of the council, rules or leads this congregation in these decisions. Regardless of what council members, or the council as a whole, think is best, it is the congregation that makes the decisions in the matters that are brought before it. Once the meeting is called to order, I am no longer president of the congregation council, but the chair of the congregational meeting, tasked with ensuring that the will of the congregation is discerned and voiced. If you have concerns or ideas, please speak to them, it is only by hearing all the ideas out there that we have the best chance of making the best decision. And while every voting member of the congregation has a right to speak and be heard at these meetings, I would ask you as a fellow member, to be mindful that we are speaking to our fellow children of God. We may strongly disagree with our fellow congregants, but we should not forget that we are called to be a community together. Not always of one mind, but always of one body. Be kind as you raise your concerns and voice your opinions.

That's enough from me for this month. Next time I see you I will probably be the father of one more child, so please forgive me if I'm not as attentive as I should be, it's probably sleep deprivation.


#### NOTE FROM THE TREASURER...

For any other purchases paid for via church accounts or church business credit cards, receipts should be attached to 8 1/2" X 11" sheet of paper with a full description of what the purchase was made for, and put into the Treasurer's mail box, also located in the office.
