Following Faith

Friends of faith, some recent ideas about church, hope, and discipleship became clearer to me. Can I testify?!

Ok, I was reading this book with some friends about "Christology" and the ongoing questions of who Jesus Christ is (or was) and what that means in our lives and in the life of the church. This book was standing on the idea that a real "Christology" (words

about Jesus being "the Christ") comes from being a disciple. Simply put, thinkers and philosophers can *think* and *philosophize* about this matter all they want, but knowing (which is alwaysalready an experience) a "Christology" means ... you'll be a disciple. It's a "disciple's discipline," the writer was saying (I like that phrase!).

Meaning, you can't "know" Christology or describe Christology without attempting to live it. Another way to say it is: You understand the idea better, or at all, only as you follow the Christ.

Like it's not a matter of the classroom, it's a matter of the heart. Or, at least it begins there.

And then it has freedom to eek all over classrooms and books and iPads and all the things!

Then, this glancing at the idea of —"Christology" as "discipleship — led me back to what we've been experiencing in our church year together. We are in Lectionary Year B. We are in the last months of Year B (the New Church Year will launch December 1st — Happy New Year, Church!). And this year has been the gospel of Mark.

I hope it's been clear and vibrant for us: This gospel of Mark is a disciple's gospel. It's written as a "disciple's discipline!" It is action-oriented, short and effective. It always has this language about joining in, and following.

For example, just a couple weeks ago was the major turning point in the gospel of Mark: j ust when Peter confessed, "You are the Messiah," Jesus immediately said: I'm going to the cross. Get in line. Come with me now.

And they were dumbfounded. We would be too.

But Mark's gospel isn't about flowery words or long Jesus-prayers. It's about following the leader. And it's a beautiful invitation, not a demand. We are *invited to the disciple's discipline:

"come after me" (1:17), "follow me" (2:14), "and he followed him on the way" (10:52).

Savor with me these last weeks in Mark's gospel in this lectionary year. And let's not just listen with our heads, but with our hearts and with ALL of us. Listen not as if, "this is what we do at 9:50am on Sundays." But draw close and push in; move around so that you can see and sense the teacher; open yourself to the merciful invitation. You are I invited to the disciple's discipline.

IN WORSHIP THIS MONTH

October 13th - The 21st Sunday after Pentecost and Blessing of the Animals

The rich man who comes to ask Jesus what he should do to inherit eternal life is a good man, sincere in his asking. Mark's gospel is alone in saying that Jesus looked on him and loved him. Out of love, not as judgment, Jesus offers him an open door to life: sell all you

own and give it to the poor. Our culture bombards us with the message that we will find life by consuming. Our assemblies counter this message with the invitation to find life by divesting for the sake of the other.

October 20th - The 22nd Sunday after Pentecost

Susan Palwick is our preacher this day! Pr Shaun presides.

Today's gospel starts with disciples obsessing over who will be closest to Jesus, leading to Jesus teaching his followers about God's take on importance and power.



Here's a great meditation on service: The seemingly impossible role of service is possible for us all because it is not just a command. It is a gift of God. Service is God's gift because it is God who serves us. Other gods have been revealed so that women and men could serve them. This God, the God of the Suffering Servant, the God of Jesus Christ, begins from the other end. God is, first of all, not a king sitting on a pyramid of the world creating pyramids of domination and subjugation in the hierarchies of church and society. Rather, the humanity of God is seen in that God chooses to be related to human beings through service. Jesus helps us to see the humanity of God so that we too can become representatives of new humanity. This is the image of God: freedom to serve others.
