Happy 70th Anniversary, church!

For seventy years, Faith Lutheran Church has been proclaiming faith together — through changing seasons, changing needs, and a changing neighborhood.

In August 1955, funding was allocated for a new Lutheran church plant in North Reno, supported by Home Mission Board (Minnesota) of the Evangelical Lutheran Church (Norwegian Heritage). In 1956 our first pastor, Amon Johnson Jr., scouted locations while worship gatherings met at the American Legion Hall on 9th and Ralston. Our first membership Sunday was June 10, 1956, with 91 folks, the installation of the pastor, and the adoption of our constitution. Back when horses and cows still grazed on the south side of 7th St, 4.23 acres were purchased for \$13k to become the site of our church and parsonage on March 23, 1956. The building was dedicated on November 24, 1957.

From the start, Faith was known for active pastors and people, thoughtful worship, and welcoming families. The pastor moved into the parsonage in 1962; fellowship hall and fireside room added in 1964, and education wing addition followed in 1968.

Faith has also been a place of food justice. In 1974, we partnered with Federal Care and Share to serve seniors in need — a ministry that grew into our city's Meals on Wheels. That spirit continues today: we were long-time hosts for the Food Bank distribution and we collect food through Shared Harvest while supporting the Reno Gospel Mission and local schools each holiday season.

Our memorial gardens began in 1982, and the '80s and '90s brought a strong emphasis on youth ministry. Our worship space was remodeled in 1994, and in 2020–2021 we even worshipped mostly online through Zoom — proving we know how to sing, share, and show hospitality however the moment requires, even "drive-thru communion."

Since 2021 we've found ways to share space with local schools/groups and undergone repair projects — paint, roof, parking lot & ramps! The sharing and the projects continue.

As we live through change, Faith — our name — is also our aim. In a world marked by disconnection, we gather to cultivate the gift that transforms. Seventy years in, that's still our story: **proclaiming faith together**, for God and neighbor! Amen.

Welcome. We are a family of faith and so glad you are here! Most of the liturgy is printed within or in the ELW Hymnal, Setting 4; Congregational responses are shown in **bold** in the bulletin.

Prayer cards are available at the end of the row. You can fill one out and hand it to our usher during the Hymn of the Day (follows the Sermon).

Children's Bulletins are available in the narthex (entrance area). Please enjoy.

God is present in **Holy Communion** and welcomes all who are hungry. You are welcome to the table. Non-communing children and adults may come forward for a blessing. Let an usher know if you would like communion at your seat.

Our **Candle Lighting station** is available during worship if you are moved to light a candle as a part of your prayer for someone or something, or in the thanksgiving or sorrows of your heart. You're welcome during communion as we sing and pray.

We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the encourager, in encouragement; the giver, in sincerity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness.

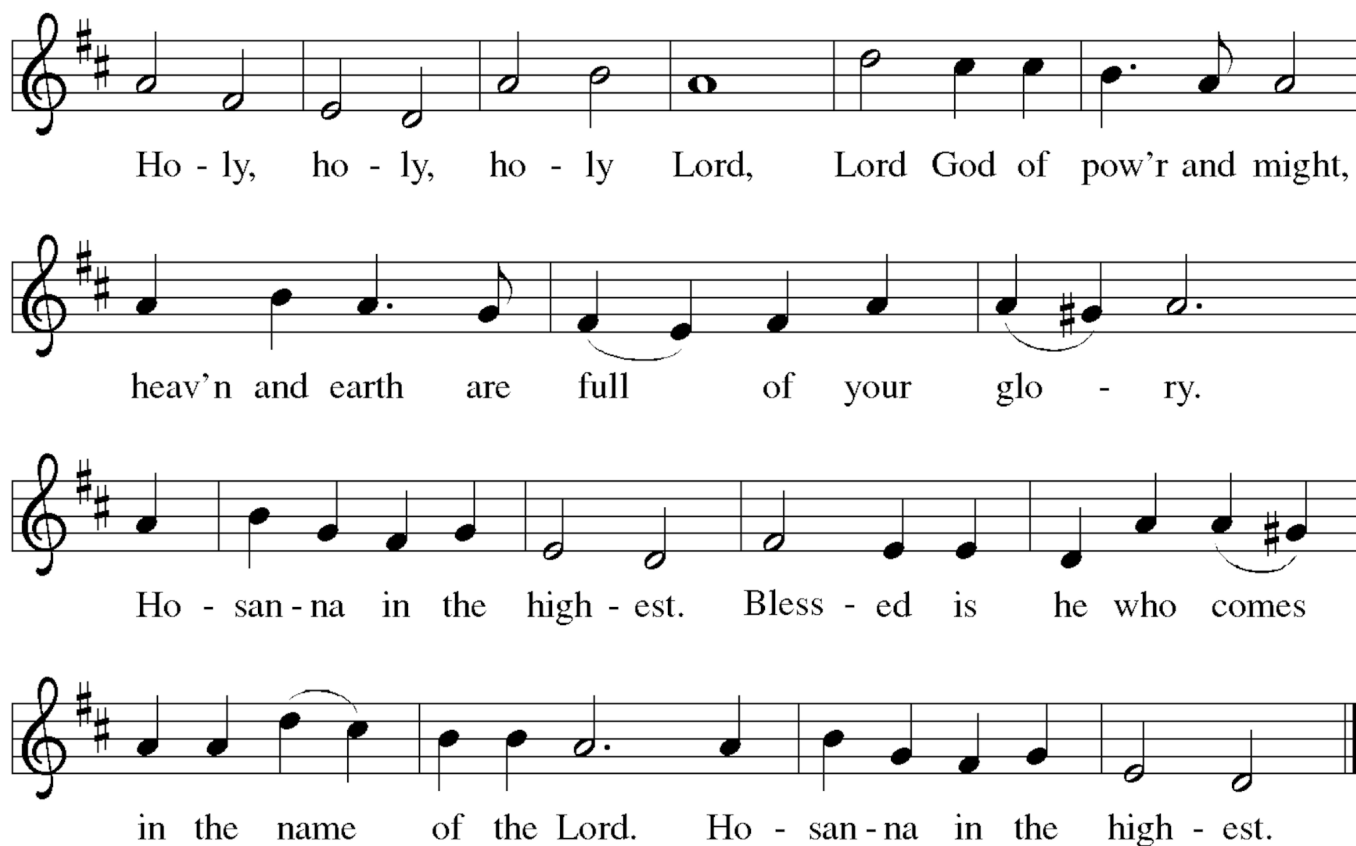
